We have security guards on the main entrance and patrolling the site 24 hours a day.



An Interview with the Legendary Susi Oddball as Oddballs marks four decades in business. We talk to one of the founders Susi Oddball who brings colourful performances, innovative workshops, and ongoing camaraderie, we sit down with the iconic Susi Oddball, a cornerstone figure whose contributions have shaped the landscape of contemporary circus arts. With her trademark eccentricity and unwavering dedication, Susi reflects on her journey from humble beginnings to becoming one of the many driving forces within the circus world.

Q: Where were you born, and how did your early experiences shape your trajectory?
A: I was born in 1954 at UCH Tottenham Court Road, I was born blind and deaf. My early struggles with health instilled in me a resilience and determination to defy the odds, setting the stage for a life filled with unexpected twists and turns.

Q: What are your earliest memories of the circus, and when did you first discover your passion for juggling?

A: At the tender age of five, I was treated to my first circus experience at Bertram Mills, courtesy of my Aunty Mary. The magic of the performers left an indelible mark on my young mind, igniting a fascination with the world of circus arts. It wasn't until 1977, while living in Hackney, that I stumbled upon juggling enthusiasts Bill, Max Oddball, and Taren, whose mesmerizing skills sparked my own journey into the art of juggling. O: Who were the jugglers and performers that inspired you in your formative years? A: I had the privilege of attending a workshop led by Pearce Halfpenny, Steve Rawlings, Fool Hardy folk, Haggis and Charlie, Tim Bat, The Original Mixture, Audrey Vincent, and Terry Cole, whose mentorship and encouragement fuelled my passion for the art of juggling. Pearce's inventive approach to manipulation and vaudeville tricks left a lasting impression on me, instilling a sense of creativity and playfulness in my own practice. Q: When did you establish your first juggling shop, and what motivated you to take that leap?

A: In 1984, alongside my partner Max Oddball, we opened our first juggling shop in Islington Park Street, embarking on a new chapter in my journey as an entrepreneur and advocate for the circus arts. Despite the challenges, our shared passion for juggling and Circus fuelled our determination to create a space where enthusiasts could gather and explore their creativity.



Q: What inspired you to organize the first British Juggling Convention, and what was the experience like?

A: In 1988, we hosted the inaugural British Juggling Convention, along with most of the Covent Garden performers and our juggling workshop volunteers, a two-day extravaganza that brought together performers and enthusiasts from across Europe.

The event was a celebration of creativity and community, showcasing the diverse talents of jugglers, acrobats, and magicians. It was a testament to the power of collaboration and collective vision in fostering growth and innovation within the circus community. Q: Susi, with Oddballs reaching its 40th anniversary, could you share your thoughts on how the company has developed over the years? Are you still happy with its trajectory? A: Yes, I am very happy with how Oddballs has evolved over the past 40 years. One of the key reasons for my satisfaction is that Oddballs has remained true to its original ethos. It has consistently been a place that not only sells juggling equipment but is always there to help customers and, importantly, to encourage the art of juggling and circus. Q: You mentioned Alex Oddball. How do you feel about the current leadership, partic-

A: I have complete confidence in Alex Oddball and the entire team. Alex is doing an excellent job in leading the company, and I'm proud of the collective effort of all my colleagues. They share the same dedication to our mission, ensuring that Oddballs continues to be a positive force within the juggling and circus community.

ularly with Alex at the helm?

Q: As we conclude our conversation, what final words do you have for the juggling community?

A: My final words to the juggling community would be that juggling is more than just a skill or a performance art; it's a form of active meditation. The rhythmic motion, the focus required, and the flow of juggling can provide a unique sense of mindfulness and presence. It's a beautiful way to connect with the present moment.

Q: That's a wonderful perspective. Is there a particular message or goal you have for the global community of jugglers?

A: Absolutely. My ultimate goal is to share the joy and benefits of juggling with the entire world. I would like to teach everyone, from every corner of the globe, how to juggle. It's not just about the physical act but the mental and emotional benefits that come with it. Juggling has the power to bring people together and create a sense of harmony, and I believe that's something everyone should experience.

O Thank you for sharing those inspiring thoughts. Any final encouragement for those who are just starting their journey into juggling?

A: To those who are just beginning their juggling journey, I would say embrace the learning process. Juggling is not just about mastering tricks; it's about the joy of progress and the discovery of your own capabilities. Don't be afraid to drop the balls - that's part of the journey. Enjoy the rhythm, the movement, and the sense of accomplishment with each improvement. Most importantly, have fun and let the magic of juggling enhance your life.

Q: Thank you, Susi, for your insigh<mark>tfu</mark>l words and your de<mark>dication to spreading</mark> the joy of juggling. It's been a pleasure dis<mark>cu</mark>ssing your journey and the impact of Oddballs on the circus community.

A: Thank you. I'm grateful for the opportunity to share my passion for juggling, and I hope it inspires many others to pick up the balls and experience the magic for themselves. Juggle on!

As Susi Oddball reflects on her remarkable journey, it's clear that her enduring passion for circus arts and unwavering commitment to community-building have left an indelible mark on the landscape of contemporary circus arts. With forty-plus years of innovation, collaboration, and artistic exploration behind her, Susi's legacy continues to inspire generations of performers and enthusiasts alike, ensuring that the spirit of the circus lives on for years to come.
